Why include vaccine coverage in employee benefits plans?

The probability of adults getting vaccinated rises when vaccines are made available for little to no charge. Higher vaccination rates lead to multiple benefits for employees and employers:

- Cost effective illness prevention
- Vaccines are a low cost preventative measure that help reduce absenteeism due to illness and increase workplace productivity.
- Supports a healthy & inclusive workplace
 Vaccines actively reduce the instances, transmission and severity of illness within a
 workplace, supporting a healthy workforce. Vaccines also help ensure different employee
 groups like LGBTQ+ and older adults have access to health prevention measures to support an
 inclusive and diverse workplace.
- High-efficacy employee wellness strategy

 Health Canada approved vaccines are safe and effective at preventing or reducing the severity of illness caused by disease, making vaccination promotion a highly effective workplace wellness strategy. Vaccination in the workplace can help employers reduce illness related disability claims and associated claim costs.

Discussion checklist for benefit advisors

When reviewing/renewing your employee benefits plan, keep in mind the following discussion points to support optimizing your benefits plan coverage for vaccinations:

Prepare a cost analysis of vaccine inclusion prior to meeting with employer
Cover vaccines as a standard inclusion in your benefits plan
Remove cost limits for vaccines
Ensure there are no barriers to vaccine access for employees E.g. contracts should allow for flexibility in vaccine prescription
Monitor vaccine coverage and uptake
Assess employee feedback To understand whether you can further reduce cost barriers, employee knowledge gaps or better support access to vaccination to increase employee vaccine uptake
